

Camps:

Students participate in school camps from Grade 2. Primary school camps include trips to Beechworth, Harrietville, Melbourne, Sovereign Hill, Canberra and Howmans Gap.

Communication

Our primary form of communication with families is through Compass. All students and parents have access to Compass, an online student management system which opens up Parent/Teacher communication on a daily basis. Compass has a wide range of tools and functionality accessible via a website or mobile app.

You can use Compass to:

- Access your child's attendance data
- Advise the College of expected absences for your child
- Communicate with teachers via email through Compass
- View the College calendars
- Receive News Item Alerts about College Events and Reminders
- View your child's reports
- Book Interviews
- Give permission and make payments for camps/excursions

At the start of the school year Parents will receive Compass login details and instructions. Prior to the start the college will send relevant information via email.

There is also a try-on rack at the school office for sizing, which can be accessed between 8 am - 4 pm on school days.

Parent Payments

Booklist order will open on the 3rd November 2025. Parents can elect to have them delivered to their home or pick up on our school collection day on 22nd January 2026. Please note that the due date for school collection is 5th December 2025.




On the first Prep transition day, we will provide parents with a flyer to remind you about the booklist.


Canteen

You can order school lunches from the canteen using the school app Compass. Click on the More button on the right at the base. On the next page, click on the Canteen icon and then on the Place Order icon.









Things to Know Before the First Day of School

To ensure you and your child are ready for the first day of school here are some things to know.

- Reader Bag Students require a school reader bag to take home readers to and from school each day. These can be purchased at the school office. They are \$13.50.
- Library Bag- Students will receive a library bag during their first week of school.
- School Hat Students will receive a hat on their first day of school.
- What to bring:
 - All items purchased on the booklist
 - Drink bottle (named)
 - Lunch Box with snacks and food for lunch
 - School bag large enough to fit the student's drink bottle, lunch box and reader bag.

Helping Your Child

Once your child starts school, your help at home is still very important. Here are a few hints for parents:

- Talk to your child about school, but don't greet your child with a series of questions. Let him/her chat after he/she is comfortable eg. drink, rest, then talk
- If your child is worried or a sad event has occurred in his/her life please email/speak with their teacher as it is important that we support them to deal with these times.
- Help your child feel good about himself/herself. Praise rather than criticise. Always promote the school as a good place to be.
- Read with them daily there is no better way to create a desire to read.
- Always feel welcome to visit the College Library with your child to borrow a book to read with them. Your child will have a designated weekly Library session when they will have the opportunity to borrow books.
- As your child progresses, listening to him/her read can make the difference between being a reluctant reader or an interested one.
- Try to use Maths in everyday life counting, sorting, ordering, comparing and measuring. Enjoy the time with your child!
- Listen to your child; good talkers are often good readers.
- A sense of security and the knowledge of love are all-important to them.
- Take time to discuss everyday happenings. Regularly give your child one of the most precious gifts you can **your time!**
