Testing times

In the coming weeks, students in **years 3, 5, 7, & 9 will be sitting the NAPLAN tests**.

The NAPLAN tests begin on Tuesday May 9th as children in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 around the country sit the writing, spelling and grammar tests of the National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). Reading and numeracy will follow on Wednesday and Thursday. NAPLAN is not a test you can "prepare" for. And making it a big deal won't improve students' performances, although it may increase their anxiety and reduce their performance.

What is in the test?

It is a general assessment of literacy and numeracy proficiency, providing a snapshot of how students around the country answer a particular set of Literacy and Numeracy test questions one day in May. How each child performs will be the result of all their years at school, not what they did in the weeks leading up to the test.

It is important all students do the very best they can during the test, as we do use the NAPLAN results to plan learning programs and to shed light on a student's learning, but it is not the only assessment made of a student or the only assessment to inform our knowledge of your child.

Year 9 Apollo Bay Camp and the Urban/Rural Partnership

We had a wonderful week in Apollo Bay with the Year 9 students. It was a week full of surfing, kayaking, mountain biking and swimming. I would like to thank Elisa and Glenn for accompanying me on the camp. Also to the Year 9 students who attended: you were all absolutely amazing and it was a pleasure to spend the week with you.

The Urban and Rural Partnership through Country Education Partnerships is a pilot program designed to give students and teachers the opportunity to experience, and be exposed to, both rural, metropolitan/major regional education, lifestyles and cultures as well as provide a great way for students to have access to a broader range of learning experiences and programs.

Bright P12 College is involved in the pilot program with Apollo Bay and a P12 School in Melbourne, Macleod College.

The aim is to further enhance an already strong partnership with Apollo Bay. Macleod College is a co-educational, Prep to Year Twelve school located in Macleod a suburb north east of Melbourne. The College grew out of the merger of Macleod High School and Macleod Primary School in 2000.

Our first activity, as part of this partnership, was the Apollo Bay Camp.

In the partnership's initial stages there were meetings where we discussed how Bright can have access to Macleod and LaTrobe University. This may be worked into the Year 10 City Experience in the future.

The aim is to build stronger connections with these schools with the objective of coming together, widening our students' knowledge and understanding of culture, diversity and acceptance, and building strong academic ties.

ANAPHYLAXIS

Each year we need to communicate with parents around anaphylaxis. Below is a guide for conversation with students/ children and gives some really good tips for students to follow.

1.	Always take food allergies seriously – severe allergies are no joke.
2.	Don't share your food with friends who have food allergies.
3.	Wash your hands after eating.
4.	Know what your friends are allergic to.
5.	If a school friend becomes sick, get help immediately even if the friend does not want to.
6.	Be respectful of a school friend's Adrenaline Autoinjector.
7.	Don't pressure your friends to eat food that they are allergic to.



Any money or unsold goods not collected by 1:00pm Saturday 3rd June 2017 will be forfeited and become the property of the BCST.



Proposed Upgrade

Great Alpine Road from Bruthen to Wangaratta

The Federal and State Governments have announced an upgrade of the Great Alpine Road from Bruthen in East Gippsland to Wangaratta in North Eastern Victoria.

Funding of \$18 million has been allocated for 'betterment' or improvement works (not maintenance) on this important freight and tourism route. \$10 million will be invested on the section of road from Bruthen to just east of Mt Hotham, while \$8 million has been allocated to upgrade the route from east of Mt Hotham to Wangaratta.

Types of works

VicRoads is looking to identify improvement works that contribute to route safety, accessibility and reliability for all modes of transport, along with neighbourhood amenity and economic activity.

Examples of improvement works likely to be included are slow vehicle pull-over bays, intersection improvements, road widening and shoulder sealing, safety barriers, pavement restoration (not patching) and bridge improvements. Rest areas, shared off-road pathways and improved pedestrian facilities may also form part of the works.

Works priorities

In developing a list of priorities for improvement works along the Great Alpine Road, VicRoads will consider road usage patterns, crash data, feedback from stakeholders such as local municipalities, the freight, tourism and emergency services sectors, and input from the broader community.

Timeframes

The VicRoads Eastern and North Eastern Regions will work together to carry out planning for these works in the 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 financial years.

Some construction will be started in late 2017, with the full program of upgrades to be completed by the end of the 2019-2020 financial year.

Community participation

Throughout March to May 2017, VicRoads is seeking feedback from the community to identify issues of concern along this route. Input from the community will be used to compile a list of proposed works to be considered under the upgrade program. Community feedback sessions are being held in:

- Bruthen Art & Information Centre – 3pm-8pm, 3 April
- Swifts Creek Community Centre – 3pm-8pm, 4 April
- Ormao Fire Station – 5pm-9pm, 5 April
- Star Hotel Bright – 3pm-8pm, 27 April
- East Gippsland Field Days, Baimisdale Aerodrome – 28 & 29 April
- Myrtleford Neighbourhood House – 3pm-8pm, 2 May
- St Mary's Hall Baimisdale – 2pm-7pm, 3 May
- Wangaratta Library – 3pm-8pm, 10 May.

A second round of community consultation in mid-late 2017 will again canvas the community to ascertain its priorities for works identified during the initial community consultation stage.
