TITRATION COMPETITION SUCCESS – WILD CATS TEAM PLACES 34TH OUT OF 286 TEAMS!!!

Bright P – 12 College entered two teams into the Royal Australian Chemistry Institute Titration Competition. Students were asked to determine the strength of a solution of ethanoic acid (acetic acid or vinegar) of unknown concentration. They first had to determine the concentration of a sodium hydroxide (caustic soda) solution by titrating it against a known volume of hydrochloric acid of known strength, and then using the caustic soda solution, to determine the strength of the acetic acid solution. Students worked in teams of three, and each team was given three different solutions of sodium

hydroxide and ethanoic acid.

Congratulations to both teams, the Wild Cats, (Clyde English, Ethan Nicholas & Rory Miller), and Team Rob, (Tasman Cocks-Wheaton, Robert Merrett, Daniel Birnie), who each produced some very accurate results. Students spent many lunchtimes practising, working hard to get their head in the game!

Special mention must be made to the Wild Cats, who achieved an excellent 34th place, very narrowly missing finishing in the top 30 teams and progressing to the National Competition.

Their final result was incredibly accurate, with an aggregate error of only 0.0037 M (moles per litre).

Well done, boys!

E-SAFETY AND OUR YOUNG PEOPLE

Last week I was fortunate to attend a presentation by Greg Gebhart from the E-Safety Commission about Digital Citizenship and E-Safety. Some interesting facts were that:

- Most children’s digital footprint is commenced on the day they are born.
- 10pm- 12midnight is the peak time for Aussie teens to be using the internet.
- Most young people are very trusting and believe online information.
- 50% of young people have taken a naked or semi naked photo of themselves and ¼ of those photos have been seen by someone else.
- There are many apps available for secret storage – e.g . A calculator app that stores hidden content.
- Exposure to inappropriate content is most likely to have occurred by 5 years of age.

Some pretty frightening statistics! However, the good news is the E-Safety Commission, which commenced about a year ago, is a great website with up to date information and it also has powers to assist when

there are problems. One of the roles of the commission is to remove any inappropriate/offensive/bullying content, contact the offender, warn them, contact parent/guardians, and if there is not a satisfactory outcome the police will be contacted. Greg stated that they have had offensive material removed within 20 minutes and the longest it has taken is 6 hours. He also said that in hundreds of cases they have only had one person reoffend. YEAR 3/4 JAN SPARKES VISIT

On Friday, 29th July, Jan Sparkes came to our classroom to speak to us about the life and culture of the Burmese people.

We thank Jan for giving her time to help us understand more about the background of our students from Burma (Law Kee, Sing Pai, Samantha and Joshua).

Following are some of the students' comments after Jan's presentation:

Today we were told where Law-Kee has lived, about his relatives and how he came to be in Australia. Law-Kee lived in Chin State which is sometimes called Chin Hills. Chin State is a state in Burma (also called Myanmar). One day, Law Kee's family moved to Malaysia where he had to live in Penang for a while before coming to Australia.

Sebastian

At ten past eleven, Jan Sparkes came to have a talk about a boy in my class called Law Kee Ling and some other things. Jan knows so many things about Burma. She showed some photos on the interactive whiteboard of Law Kee and Law Kee's family. I never knew how hard it was for Burmese children and adults to live in their country. Jan brings Burmese families to Australia. I learnt so much in that lesson.

Chance-Elysse

I did not know that kids immigrated to different countries. I wouldn't want to have to move to a different country but Jan said that it was not that nice in Burma (Myanmar) because of the government. Law-Kee immigrated to Australia from Burma with his family and he is in my class. He is learning English very quickly! He is very lucky to be in Australia right now. It must be hard to go to a different country and have people speak to you in a foreign language.

Sophie

Today Jan Sparkes came to talk about Burma and Chin State. That's where Law Kee lived. Burma was the old way of saying Myanmar. She told us what it looked like in (Burma, Myanmar). Also how they walked with no shoes because they were so poor.

Luca

I never knew that the Burmese people had to build their own houses and sometimes make their own playgrounds. The Burmese people grow their own food because they do not have enough money to buy food. Some of the children do not even go to school.

Chloe

Today I learned that if you are from a foreign country you have to live in Australia for four years to become an Australian citizen.

Blake B

I learnt about some of the challenges Burmese children and adults have to face like: making their own clothes, building houses in Malaysia, cooking by fire, learning in very poor conditions and not having enough money to buy things like shoes. Also travelling to different parts of the world would be very difficult and different.

Saskia

Today I learnt some things about Burma. These are a few of the things that I learnt: In Burma they do have electricity but the electricity is very dodgy. Sometimes they use candles. Another thing that I learnt was that people from Burma don't just go to Australia; they also go to America, Norway and New Zealand. Also, kids in Burma have playgrounds but they sometimes have to make them themselves. Burmese people have farms and grow some of their food. They like to eat rice, vegetables and soup.

Holly

Today I learnt that when Burmese people come to Australia, they stop in Malaysia for a little bit. One picture Jan showed us was of twenty-five people living in a two bedroom house. Another thing I learnt was that it takes four years to become an Australian citizen. Law Kee lived in Chin State, which is in Burma. He has three younger sisters and one of them is at school. Law Kee also has two cousins at school. Australia is a lucky country and we are lucky to live here and even luckier to have people from other countries live here.

Alison

I didn't know Burmese people had such a hard life. I never knew they didn't have any shoes or umbrellas or raincoats or many

houses. I am so grateful to live in Australia. Law Kee is my Best Dana Chin (friend).

Tyler

I learned that Burma or Myanmar has states, it is not a country without states. Also the pictures were fantastic! I also learned that the government was very mean to the people of Chin State and another state that I can't remember the name of. The Burmese people are forced to leave because it is not safe there so they migrate to safer countries like Australia and Canada or the United Kingdom as well as New Zealand and the U.S.A.

Billy

Today I learned from Jan that some of the Myanmar people had to build their own homes in the jungle when they first came to Malaysia. I also learned that the Burmese people migrated to different countries like Canada, America, Norway and New Zealand. Different groups of Myanmar people speak their own language because they were isolated from each other by the mountains.

I didn't know that Burma (Myanmar) had states like we do (or divisions). Also I didn't know that some people in Burma couldn't talk to each other because different states have their own language.

Today I learned that in Burma or Myanmar they don't have much. They usually live in tiny huts. When Jan Sparkes came, I learnt all about Law Kee Ling's background and how the Burmese people move to different countries all around the world like Canada, Norway, America and New Zealand.

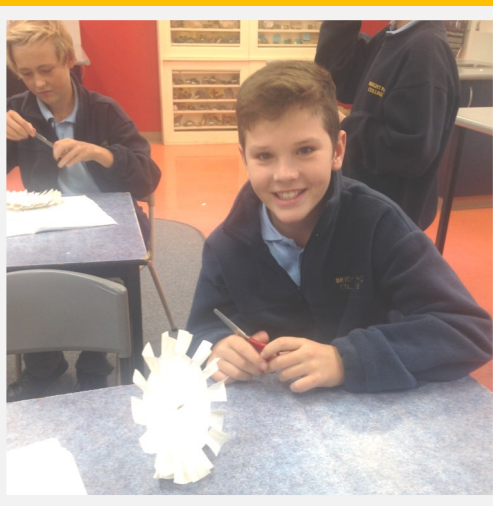
