The next move was the same as the second and then we jumped off the stage with our hands in the air. We stopped after five jumps, put one hand on our hip, moved our hands and continued until we were off the stage.

Practice Exam Timetable



Cost

All excursions must be prepaid to confirm your booking. NO REFUNDS will be given on excursions unless a doctor's certificate is provided. Please do not send your child with money, as no extra purchases will be permitted.

Cancellation & Late fees

Unless 2 working days notice is given, sessions will be charged for regardless of whether your child attends or not. Alpine Kids Club Vacation Program operates from 8:00am to 6:00pm.
