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Principal's

Report

We Are Listening

As you may remember, we sent out a parent survey last year to which many of you responded with your feedback and suggestions for how to improve our college. I would like to take this opportunity to once again thank you for your time in completing the survey and to let you know that as a key input to our continuous self-evaluation process, we will be distributing a new survey which we would strongly invite you all to complete near the end of this term.

Also, you may be curious to know what improvements we have put into place as a result of last year's survey and I am pleased to share with you all the work that has been done as a result of your feedback.

- Formal presentation of the survey results to all staff which was followed by a working session to identify ways we could implement the feedback
- Working established group consisting of parents, students, staff and college council members to identify and document our College and Purpose Values Statement that we are now using guide to the behaviours expected from all students and staff at our college. This new document will be made publicly available with the launch of the college's new website.
- <u>A brand-new website</u> has been created to improve how we communicate college news and information to you. We are scheduled to launch this website within a few weeks

so stay tuned for this exciting development.

However, we are certainly not finished. We are continuously looking at a number of improvements to how we deliver outstanding education and promote total wellbeing for every student at the college. We are also seeking ways to more effectively communicate with you during the process.

Temporary closure of Primary girls' toilets

As of Monday 18th April 2016 the Primary girls' toilets will be closed for repair. This is a pre-emptive measure to prevent any risk of asbestos breaking and students being exposed.

The toilet partition walls containing asbestos have been identified, during the school's regular asbestos inspection, as showing greater signs of wear and tear. The Department of Education & Training immediately Management Team was contacted following the inspection and they sent out specialists to assess the issue, plus undertake air-monitoring. Whilst no issue of exposure to broken asbestos has occurred, a decision was made to close the toilets to prevent damage occurring.

To ensure the absolute safety of students and staff, the school has arranged for the removal of this material to be performed by experts in accordance with Victorian Occupational Health and Safety Regulations. An expert Occupational Hygienist will supervise the removal process and perform air quality monitoring throughout the works.

The work area has been cordoned off and will remain so throughout the removal works that will be undertaken out of school hours.

Planning for remediation works to be completed as quickly as possible is currently in process and I will update you on the status of the repair works as they progress.

Female primary students will be utilizing the ladies' toilets in the Administration building in the short term and the Department has agreed to assist the school with the provision of temporary amenities until the asbestos remediation works are completed.

Bright P-12 College and the Department of Education will be working to have this

situation rectified as soon as possible. All asbestos is to be removed from the toilets and new partitions installed and following completion of the primary girls' amenities, the primary boys' amenities will also be repaired by the Department.

If you wish to discuss this further please do not hesitate to contact the school.

As can be seen, It has already been a very busy start to the term with a couple of our major annual events taking place over this week and next.

Below is a quick reminder of coming events;

Fun Run

The Bright P-12 College Fun Run is a major fundraising event for the College and a great day for families. There are 6 events with various starting times and age categories. All the family can get involved and enjoy a walk or a run. I would encourage all our families to join in and support this event.

3-12 Cross Country Run

This is the only sporting event involving primary and secondary students currently on the Bright P-12 College calendar and as such is a special day for us. Last year was the first time we combined the two events into one and it was amazing, a very rewarding and symbolic event showcasing our P-12 status. This year we have sent home permission forms with the students to be signed by the parent/guardian as a way of ensuring all parents are aware of the run and, if possible, can come and join us on the day. Almost all the primary permission forms are returned but the secondary are lagging. Secondary parents please ensure your son/daughter has returned their signed permission form to the office immediately, as training needs to proceed. It would be hugely disappointing if we only had a small number of our secondary students running and the rest in normal classes.

Autumn Festival Float

Well, this year, given the 'Alpine Kids are Active Kids' theme of the parade, we are not using a float; instead, we are walking, jogging, running in circles, our way down the main street of Bright. Attitude to Schools Survey

Students from Year 5 to 12 will be completing the Attitude to Schools Survey over the next couple of weeks. The survey asks students questions based on their personal wellbeing at school and also how they perceive the teaching and learning at our school. Once the data has been submitted, the school will use it to inform change and areas for priorities in teaching and learning and student wellbeing and engagement.

NAPLAN Testing

The National Assessment Program-Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2016 tests for Years 3, 5, 7, and 9 students will be held on Tuesday 10th May, Wednesday 11th May and Thursday 12th May 2016. NAPLAN tests assess student knowledge and skills in writing, reading, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

The results of the tests provide information for students, parents, teachers and principals, which can be used to improve student achievement.

All students are expected to participate in the NAPLAN tests. During test week, catch up tests will be available for individual students who are absent on test days. These students may undertake catch-up tests on the days in the test week after the scheduled test, up to and including Friday 13th May 2016.

A pamphlet explaining NAPLAN in greater depth will go home with students soon.

Uniform

As we are seeing unseasonably warm weather this Autumn, School Council was happy to support the extension of the changeover period by a week (and longer if necessary). Updates will be sent to all families via the Skoolbag app and COMPASS.

However, as we move into the cooler months is it important to keep warm. It is important that over jackets, beanies and non-school uniform scarves are removed prior to period 1 in the morning. Students who are wearing these items to class will be asked to remove them, if they are continually wearing the item throughout the day a teacher

may ask for the item and hand it back at the end of the day. No hoodies are to be worn either over or under any school uniform item. The polar fleece jacket may be worn as an extra laver of warmth over either the windcheater or the V-neck jumper. Also remember that the long-sleeved polo t-shirt can be worn. School council has agreed to phase out the windcheater over the remainder of this year, with it not being available in 2016 (either for purchase or to be worn past 2016). Immunisations

Year 7s first immunisations were carried out on Tuesday 19^{th.} Prior to that I spoke to all the year 7s about immunisation and how research demonstrates that immunisation saves lives and makes it possible for Victorians to live free from the illness and disability caused by many infectious diseases. I let them know that adverse and allergic reaction rates for these immunisations are extremely low and they would be monitored by staff following their immunisation to further safeguard this. They also learnt it is normal to have some redness or swelling at the immunisation site, but this is only temporary.

Hopefully this information session gave the students a better understanding of why immunisation is important. I also reassured them about the process and hopefully this helped to reduce any anxiety they may have been feeling around immunisations.
