The NAPLAN tests begin on Tuesday May 10th as children in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 around the country sit the writing, spelling and grammar tests of the National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). Reading and numeracy will follow on Wednesday and Thursday. NAPLAN is not a test you can behalf of the Bright P-12 College community we thank "prepare" for. And making it a big deal of it won't improve students' performances, although it may increase their anxiety and reduce their performance.

Last Saturday Bright P-12 College participated in the What is in the test? NAPLAN is not connected to the AusVELs curriculum, so it is not an assessment of the content students learn each day at school. NAPLAN's reference document is the "Statements of Learning".

> It is important all students do the very best they can during the test, as we do use the NAPLAN results to plan learning programs and to shed light on a student's learning, but it is not the only assessment made of a student or the only assessment to inform our knowledge of your child.

### **NAPLAN Testing**

The National Assessment Program- Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2012 tests for Years 3, 5, 7, and 9 students will be held next week. NAPLAN tests assess student knowledge and skills in writing, reading, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

The results of the tests provide information for students, parents, teachers and principals, which can be used to improve student achievement.

All students are expected to participate in the NAPLAN tests. During test week, catch up tests will be available for individual students who are absent on test days. These catch-up tests will take place in the Conference Room with Ms Olley on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> May 2015.

A pamphlet explaining NAPLAN in greater depth is on its way home with students.

### Psychology Excursion to Melbourne

The Year 11 and 12 Psychology students took a trip to Melbourne to visit The Dax Centre and the Melbourne Museum last week. Students were given an innovative presentation that drew on the expertise of scientists from the Florey Institute of Neuroscience and Mental Health, and individuals who have lived with mental illness. Students gain a multifaceted perspective on artworks and mental illness, encompassing the artistic, scientific and psychological.

Whilst at the Museum, students carried out a series of investigations in The Mind: Enter the Labyrinth exhibition which included interactive activities, displays and exhibits that are relevant to psychology.
