To celebrate National Science Week (10-18 August), we'll be holding Daily Quizzes & Jokes for students in Prep to Year 12 at school.


We're also hosting a Science Quiz on Wednesday 14th August 2024 at 1pm in the school Library.


- Roles available in all services across the Australian Defence Force

Yr 9 SCIENCE

P-2 & 3-6 CHOIRS



On Thursday last week, students in our Prep-Year 2 Choir and Year 3-6 Choir travelled to Albury to perform at the Albury / Wodonga Eisteddfod. Both groups did a great job. The P-2 Choir came in first in their section and the Yr 3-6 Choir came third. Congratulations to all students involved!



Yr 12 BIOLOGY

Unit 3&4 Biology Student Designed Experiments. As part of Unit 4 Area of Study 3, students designed their own experiment to investigate a factor affecting the activity of an enzyme. Specifically, students investigated the action of the catalase enzyme in breaking down hydrogen peroxide. Hydrogen peroxide is a toxic by-product of metabolic reactions in many organisms that use oxygen, and the catalase enzyme breaks this toxic substance down into harmless water and oxygen. Students investigated catalase activity in yeast, celery, carrot, potato and beef liver. They selected different independent variables to manipulate, including temperature, pH, enzyme concentration and substrate concentration.




DINNER PLAIN UPDATE

Hello from Dinner Plain! All classes have been immersed in an enriching exploration of the Paris Olympics. This thematic unit has been educational and engaging, offering our students a comprehensive understanding of this historic event while fostering teamwork, creativity, and global awareness. We are exploring themes including Exploring Olympic History; Discovering Paris; Australian Athletes and Uniforms; Following Events and Medal Tallies; Mini Dinner Plain Olympic Games.



Yr 9 & 10 OUTDOOR EDUCATION

Our Yr 9 and 10 Outdoor Education students have been participating in a series of preparation activities ahead of their cross country ski days at Falls Creek. Roller skiing is a great way to develop skills in cross country skiing. This was challenging for all students but they all did well learning the skills required.



NAIDOC WEEK

This year, we celebrated NAIDOC in the first two weeks of Term 3. From Prep to Year 12, students engaged in myriad different activities, including reading, storytelling, art and movies.

On Friday 26th July, we held a collaborative art session for students across the school. The design for the art piece was based on this year's theme 'Keep the fire burning! Blak, loud and proud'. To create this, we used our painted hands to

create the image of a growing flame. The upper Primary students then wrote the theme across the piece. Whilst this took place, we were listening to the NAIDOC 2024 playlist and discussing the artists' varied songs. It was a fantastic learning experience where students worked collaboratively and respectfully. Overall, the school-wide activities supported the children's awareness and understanding about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture and history.

Also, students in Years 7-9 Japanese decorated the 'fire' kanji using Aboriginal flag colours and symbols to share their creative energy in support of NAIDOC Week. These collaborative words are on display in our school library.





Yr 10 CAMP

Year 10 Camp always goes to Melbourne for a city experience, this is also the last year level camp for these seniors in high school. We had a great camp! Students went Ice Skating, to the old Melbourne Gaol, toured the MCG and went out for a fancy dinner at William Angliss. We also completed the TAC Drive to Survive program at the Melbourne Museum. Students got to create ads in the studio and trial the VR experiences in the program. Lastly, students visited the Salvation Army and dropped off the incredibly generous donations for the homeless as well as see what the Salvation Army does to help Melbourne's Homeless Youth.
