SCHOOL-BASED APPRENTICESHIP/TRAINEESHIP

Year 11 student Luke A has started his career journey in automotive by taking up a School Based Apprenticeship and Traineeship (SBAT) position at Alpine Auto Repairs after a great work experience placement. Luke will be studying a CERT III in Light Vehicle Automotive Technology at GOTAFE Wangaratta and spending two day per week hands on in the work place.

An SBAT for Luke means he can further his vocational studies while still completing school, he will also be supported by the Bright P-12 College Careers Team, Shane from HeadStart SBAT and Jess from Busy at Work Apprenticeships, ensuring a strong support structure for SBAT students.

Employer Daniel said it was so good to have a young person of Luke's maturity so interested in the automotive field.

Luke said "this opportunity provides me with the opportunity to provide for myself in the future and learn great skills along the way."

We are very proud of Luke for exploring his pathway in a trade. We thank Daniel and the Alpine Auto Repairs team for providing a supportive work place.

WHOOPING COUGH

The Ovens Murray Public Health Unit (OMPHU) is monitoring a significant increase in Pertussis (Whooping Cough) cases in our region this year, particularly among school-aged children. In Victoria and NSW, there have been over 10 times the number of Pertussis cases in 2024 than for the whole of 2023. Children aged 9-12 years account for nearly 40% of all notified cases.

Anyone can get Pertussis. Infants less than 6 months of age are at greatest risk of severe disease, hospitalisation, and death. These infants are too young to be fully immunised. Many infants who get Pertussis catch it from older children and adults who might not even know they are infected.


Yr 2 LITERACY

Yr 12 ALV - MARRUNG LEADERS DAY

On Wednesday 4th September students in the Year 12 Aboriginal Languages of Victoria (ALV) class provided an informative presentation at the regional Marrung Leaders Day.

Each school has a Marrung Leader whose role it is to provide support to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students enrolled at their school as well as all staff and students to assist them in providing an inclusive environment at school that considers Aboriginal perspectives. Natasha Tough is the Marrung Leader at Bright P-12 College.

There were approximately 25 Marrung leaders from different schools within our region in attendance at the regional Marrung Leaders Day. Jody Grimmond, Senior Education Improvement Leader (SEIL) invited our students to present to the group about the VCE Aboriginal Languages of Victoria subject offered at Bright P-12 College. Our school is the only school in the state that offers this subject to students, which makes their learning and experiences quite unique at a VCE level.

Students spoke about the Dhudhuroa language - its history and present state, the history of the subject being taught at Bright P-12 College, some of the assessment tasks they have completed during the course and their personal learning highlights from the course. The Marrung leaders posed several questions, some which were reasonably challenging, however our students responded with confidence and interesting details.






Yr 9 SCIENCE

Year 9 students have been investigating the types of chemical reactions. They have now begun exploring acid and bases, and how we can test if a substance is one of these by using indicators. There are so many natural indicators in the world, and the students were able to make their own using Red Cabbage and test various everyday substances.

Students then went on to test the same substances using universal indicator and aligning the results to the pH scale.



PREP JAPANESE

Haru – Spring is here!!! We are now in the season of beautiful blossoms all around. The Prep students had a picnic under the blossoms, and they are learning about spring festivals and cherry blossoms in Japan. After listening to the story of the monkey and the crab, the students enjoyed onigiri (rice balls) as a treat – a perfect picnic under the beautiful blossoms!

A team of Secondary students attended the Ovens Murray athletics competition where they represented Bright P-12 College exceptionally well. School pride was clearly in evidence and our students cheered each other on as they participated in a range of activities.

On National HPE day, during their usual PE theory lesson, the Year 11 PE class participated in a Croquet session at the local club. Students had such a great experience with the volunteers in Year 10 they've been keen to have another session all year and so it was only fitting on National HPE Day that we organise a community excursion. It was a beautiful morning to be out interacting with our community in such a positive, and slightly competitive way. Yr 12 CAREERS / PATHWAY SUPPORT

The careers team are working alongside our current Year 12 students to support them with their plans post-Secondary school. For students interested in applying for University and Tafe, a series of Victoria Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) information sessions have been held during Term 3, to provide information on how to apply for courses, special consideration and scholarships.

We currently have students exploring courses from Engineering to Veterinary Science and Aviation to Sports Management. Students are applying for courses in Melbourne, regional Victoria and interstate. A number of Year 12 students are also pursuing vocational careers in industries such as cooking, childcare, forest fire management and dance. Our careers team also support students with GAP year opportunities by giving them ideas and helping with applications when needed.



STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

Year 12 student Ruby B was selected to compete at South America's largest and most prestigious international indoor showjumping competition, Longines São Paulo CSI-W Sociedade Hipica Paulista. This experience was incredible.

The journey started by travelling to a world class stable where Ruby trialled 3 different horses - the owners and Chef d'Equipe would decide if they thought the combination was a match. SI Baltar, a tricky but incredibly talented horse, was selected to be Ruby's competition horse. Horses were transported to the facility where Ruby had one more day of training. The next day, Ruby competed in a training competition where she placed 3rd. Ruby then prepared for the three days of competition. Final results: 3rd in the final 1.15 speed class; all three classes points were combined, Ruby placed 3rd overall; best international junior rider over the three days. An amazing performance! Congratulations, Ruby!



What is Freeride? Some say Freeride is the ultimate expression of all that is fun and liberating about sliding on snow in winter! The Freeride World Tour showcases riders competing on legendary and challenging alpine faces at renowned



ski resorts across the globe. For the first time this year a Freeride World Tour event was held at Mt Hotham. Bright P -12 College students Neve W and Jess S took the opportunity to take their talent to New Zealand, following up the local event by participating in the NZ Junior FWT 3* event at the Remarkables on the stunning south island. The event had a last minute course change and the juniors competed on the same face as the 4* FWT Qualifying event the week before on the Alta Chutes face. Neve claimed second place after her solid run in the Snowboard Women's Under 18 event! On the back of her first place at Mt Hotham, her points gained for the FWT Junior Region for Europe/Oceania 2025 rankings has her currently sitting in second for Snowboard Women's Under 18 tally. Congrats Neve! Well done to Jess who also had a great run in the Ski Women's Under 18's event.

Year 8 student Zeke T applied for and was awarded a scholarship through The Chumpy Pullin Foundation. The scholarship gave him a season of coaching and training with Team Hotham. He was at Team Hotham every chance he could, while still participating in the BCST (Bright College Snowsports Team) program. He attended Snowsports Australia's Snowboard Cross Futures Camp and was coached by some riders from the National Team. He also went to Jindabyne with Team Hotham and trained at the National Snowsports Training Centre. Victorian Interschools were held at Mt Buller and Zeke finished 6th in Snowboard Cross and 9th in Snowboard GS (Giant Slalom). He then went to the National Interschools Event in Perisher and finished 15th in Snowboard GS, and 20th in Snowboard Cross.

Personally, Zeke reached a number of goals he had set for himself prior to winter and successfully learned many new jumps and tricks. He has had a very busy, but extremely rewarding winter.



STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

As an eager participant in the Bright College Snowsports Team (BCST) program, Year 8 student Sophie M was one of many who represented Bright P-12 College at the Victorian Interschools Competition held at Mount Buller in late August, 2024. As a skier, the two events she competed in were Giant Slalom and Skier Cross (which is a little like a BMX track with skis). There were around 220 other competitors in her Year 7-8 - known as Division 3 Girls in each of these events.

She finished 28th after two runs in the Alpine Giant Slalom, with the Top 20 going onto Perisher to compete in the National Titles, so just missed the cut (by about 1 second).

In the Skier Cross, the first run was timed and the top 32 skiers competed in the Final with the Top 20 going onto Perisher to compete in the National Titles. Sophie finished 20th, so she qualified to compete for the National Title Div 3 Girls Skier cross, held in early September.

Held at Perisher ski resort in NSW, some of the best skiers from around the country gathered to compete for the National Titles. The course was narrow and fast - and the competition between the 60 qualifiers was fierce. The girls had two timed runs, with the fastest of the two runs determining their placings. Sophie finished in 35th place.

From Sophie's parents "We were delighted to cheer on the many other participants from Bright P-12 College. And in fact, we were one of only a handful of Public Schools who had competitors competing at the Interschools National Titles. That's a great testament to the excellent BCST program - and the volunteers who help make it happen."





DINNER PLAIN UPDATE

Our Dinner Plain students recently enjoyed a special Behind the Scenes Tour of Mount Hotham. Students were lucky enough to meet the man behind the Mount Hotham snow reports, Head Ski Patroller Bill Barker, and even had their own snow report published.
