Earlier this term we hosted 14 students and their teachers from Gamagori in Japan. We have long had an exchange relationship with Gamagori and last year, 17 of our secondary students were hosted in Gamagori. All of the Gamagori students began the week with speeches in assembly. They did a brilliant job of confidently introducing themselves in English and letting us know a little about Gamagori and their families and hobbies. Gamagori presented the school with a Kokeshi doll - a doll which represents good fortune and health for children.

The students attended classes with their host brothers and sisters and helped in some Primary Japanese classes with activities like origami, calligraphy and making onigiri (rice balls). Students also went to Beechworth with their hosts and learned a bit about the Gold Rush and Ned Kelly. Students were taken around town with their families, and many were very excited to see kangaroos and have a try of meat pies and vegemite! We held the Sayounara party with a trivia night. WHOOPING COUGH

Our school is managing a number of whooping cough cases. Whooping cough is a serious and very contagious respiratory infection. It should be diagnosed by a doctor and treated immediately to lessen the risk of a serious illness and stop the spread to others. The health and safety of our school community is paramount, and we aim to protect all of us at Bright P-12 College and ensure that students can return to school as soon as they are well. Please monitor your child for symptoms of whooping cough. If you child becomes unwell, please see a doctor for diagnosis and treatment as soon as possible. To reduce the spread of infection and protect others within the school community, students who are diagnosed with whooping cough must not attend our school for 21 days after their cough was first present, or until they have taken a full course of antibiotics prescribed by a doctor (usually a 5-day course). To further reduce the spread of infection to your child and the school community, some students who were in the same classroom as a student diagnosed with whooping cough should not attend school. The school will contact you directly if this applies to your family. These exclusions are required by the Victorian Public Health and Wellbeing Regulations 2019. Students participated in hands-on activities and listened to experts from each organisation describe their job and explain how students may be able to get involved/employed in the future. A group of students from our school (Jenna S, Taylor A and Kira M) are members of Resilient Alpine Youth Squad (RAYS) and it was great that they were able to help organise this fantastic excursion for the students of the Alpine Shire. RAYS is a youth group within the Alpine Shire committed to empowering other young people in being agents of change whether that is during disasters or in general day to day advocacy.







Yr 10 CAD/CAM/ROBOTICS

Year 10 CAD/CAM students were challenged to research, design and manufacture a mousetrap powered car that could cover three metres in the quickest time. All parts were designed using AutoCAD and Sketch Up and produced using the laser cutter and 3D printers. Spider webs, Jack-o-lanterns and Cabbage - it must be October! The Year 9 Japanese class got a chance to get creative and culinary with some Halloween themed Okonomiyaki. 'Konomi' meaning 'what you like' and 'yaki' meaning 'fry/grill' translates to 'grilled how you like it'. Okonomiyaki is a simple and delicious staple food that originated in Hiroshima gaining popularity after WWII due to food shortages, and very popular today. With pantry staple ingredients flour, water, egg plus cabbage, and topped with sweet BBQ sauce (tonkatsu or okonomiyaki sauce) and kewpie mayonnaise, it's a cheap, easy, sweet yet savoury snack.



TECH SCHOOL STUDENT AMBASSADORS

Our school recently established a relationship with the Wangaratta Tech School, due to open in 2026. After completing an expression of interest, a group of students ranging from Year 6 to Year 9 were selected as Bright P-12 College's "Tech School Ambassadors". Over the next 18 months, these students will have opportunities to engage with other Victorian Tech/STEM schools, with their feedback helping to inform the design and fit out of the Wangaratta school.

At the end of last term, nine of our ambassadors visited Whittlesea Tech School where they experienced a day in the life of a tech school student. Workshops included wind tunnel experiments, design in Adobe Illustrator, laser cutting





and programming a state-of-the-art robotic arm. The day concluded with a tour of the campus which really got the students thinking about the technologies they'd like to see in the Wangaratta school.

Last week, a group of our STEM Ambassadors in Year 7 and 8 travelled to Beechworth to take part in an exciting STEM Drone Experience Program, sponsored by the Wangaratta Tech School. The program included students from Beechworth High School, Myrtleford P-12 College, and Bright P-12 College.

Throughout the day, students learned the fundamentals of drone flight, including how to operate drone controllers and adhere to CASA aviation safety rules. They explored the various ways drones are used in today's workforce, such as mapping coral bleaching on the Great Barrier Reef, surveying farms for fruit harvests, and tracking flood damage.

In the first session, students focused on CASA regulations and basic drone control. The second session introduced them to autonomous drone coding, where students had to simulate mapping a flash-flooded area of Melbourne. With limited access on the ground, drones were tasked with assessing damage and determining where help was needed.

Students also viewed short videos from scientists, showcasing real-world drone applications and their importance in industries like environmental research and disaster response. This was a fantastic opportunity for our students to engage in hands-on learning and explore future career possibilities in STEM fields.



CONCERT BAND - SEEKING NEW MEMBERS

The Bright P-12 College Concert Band is a musical ensemble comprising of brass, woodwind and percussion players. It's an orchestra without the stringed instruments. We are looking to recruit new students to the program for 2024 from



Year 2 and above. We have a number of instruments available to learn including flutes, clarinets, saxophones and trumpets. 


FLASHBACK TO AUGUST 1975
