

## Yr 11 GEOGRAPHY FIELD TRIP

These included comparing the acidity of different brands of white vinegar, comparing the acid content of different types of vinegar and determining the basic properties of cleaners. Some students chose to use gravimetric analysis to determine the salt content of a variety of different biscuits.



#### Yr 9 SCIENCE
