


### 2024 YEARBOOK - DEADLINE EXTENDED

# Yr 9 CAREERS BIG DAY IN



Our Year 9 students recently experienced a full day in our annual 'Careers Big Day In' event. Students participated in a range of activities, both at school and in the community.

In small groups, students heard from community members about their career pathways since leaving school, learning that no-ones pathway is a straight line and many decisions influence the direction taken in work and study.

Students also participated in a mock interview for a job they applied for during their careers classes leading up to the day. Community members acted in the role of interview panel members, providing a realistic interview situation for students. Students were given scores, including in resumé writing and presentation, and the highest scorers for each job were awarded a prize. Students displayed fantastic preparedness, confidence and provided relevant well-thought-out examples during the interviews.

Our Year 9 students also visited local businesses in small groups, to get a first-hand understanding of the scope of a small business or organisation. They were able to consult with many professional and skilled people about what is involved in running a business or providing a service.

We would like to thank Alpine Shire, DEECA, Espire Clothing and Foresight Engineering for the time and commitment taken to provide this opportunity to the students. We would also extend our gratitude to the community members who volunteered their time throughout the day. Without their time and commitment, the day would not be possible.

Student feedback was very positive and constructive, giving us a great insight into the value of running the day, now in its 8th year.


# STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

#### **CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)**

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is \$150 for Primary school students and \$250 for Secondary school students


