GALA DAY

The Bright Autumn Festival is on Saturday 4th May. All students from Prep to Year 12 are encouraged to attend. Students need to arrive at the bus stop on Park St by 1:15pm and an adult will be required to collect all students at Centenary Park at the end of the parade (approx. 2.30pm).

MUSIC EXCURSION

Some of our Primary musicians performed at the Alpine View Childcare Centre. Our Prep-Year 2 Choir and Year 3-6 Choirs performed and our students also presented a trumpet duet and clarinet duet. The younger children really enjoyed the performance and so did our students. This was great practice for other upcoming music performances.









Yr 12 BIOLOGY

Bacterial transformation. Our Unit 3&4 Biology students became genetic engineers. They inserted green fluorescent protein genes from a jelly fish, ampicillin resistance genes from bacteria and surface protein genes from hepatitis B virus into E.coli bacteria. This genetic engineering is used to mass produce hepatitis B surface antigens to be used in vaccinations. Basically, they made bacteria glow in the dark! The experiment was very successful and this is testament to the student's careful laboratory techniques.









Yr 10 WORK EXPERIENCE

All Year 10 students participated in Work Experience during the second last week of Term 1. The purpose of work experience is for students to immerse themselves in a vocation that they are interested in and to then determine if this is a career that they may pursue in the future. It was great to witness students going through the process of seeking employment, confirming work arrangements, and then undertaking the placement for 5 days. Towards the end of the week, Bright P-12 College staff checked in with each student's employer and it was wonderful to hear the positive feedback. This year we had students placed in a wide variety of placements. These included: local primary schools, a local veterinary clinic, Northeast Health, Alpine Childrens Services, Maru Wildlife Park, the fashion industry, TV set design in Melbourne and a wide variety of local trades, retailers and hospitality venues. Thanks to all the businesses that have supported our students this year with this program, it is greatly appreciated.

SUSTAINABILITY - TREE PLANTING

This term, students have been helping our Sustainability Coordinator Darren Wood by planting native plants along the inside perimeter of our new deer-proof and kangaroo-proof fence. Following extensive research, including

liaison with local Parks Victoria and DEECA (Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action, formerly DELWP) representatives, the native plants were chosen for various reasons: attracting beneficial insects and other native animals, including birds; increasing ecological biodiversity of the site with a focus on species that are native to the Alpine region; educating our students about Aboriginal uses for the plants as food and medicine; understanding the role certain plants have in providing fire resistance.

































DHUDHUROA LANGUAGE DAY

Last term, Beechworth Montessori school hosted students from the five schools that currently teach Dhudhuroa language to their students: Harrietville PS, Dederang PS, Wooragee PS, Beechworth Montessori and Bright P-12 College. Around 220 students participated on the day, ranging in age from Prep / Foundation through to Year 12.

Support on the day was given by Dhudhuroa people, including Nathan Lovett-Murray who spoke his first Dhudhuroa words to the students as the Welcome to Country to open the event. Nathan's son, Mara and Larissa Hume also attended. There was support from the regional Koorie Engagement Support Officer (KESO) team, Victorian Aboriginal Education Association Incorporated (VAEAI), a Linguist from the University of Melbourne Research Unit for Indigenous Language, Dr Bill Forshaw, the team from Thamarrurr Youth, school staff members and the Dhudhuroa Language teachers who coordinated the day, Mica Corscadden, Kylie Giltrap and Katrina Ciolli.

Students were divided into four groups and rotated through the activity stations. Each station incorporated a different learning style, but all had a focus on learning and using Dhudhuroa language. The craft station set students the challenge of using natural resources to create a visual representation of the word given on their card. The singing station encouraged students to sing the 'Cuddly Bawiaka' (koala) song, that included a number of Dhudhuroa words. This song must have connected with the surrounds as we were fortunate enough to have a live 'mascot' koala climbing in the trees in the school grounds during the morning!! The art station provided an opportunity for students to work together and produce a take home canvas for each school. The traditional games station encouraged students to practise jumping like a yawarro (kangaroo) in relay races and to fly like a nianyo (black cockatoo) during an octopus game.

The Dhudhuroa language day was a huge success. It was a day that celebrated and showcased the enthusiasm and achievements of the ongoing and growing language revival efforts for Dhudhuroa. Many thanks to all involved.

STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT


