

CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY PATHWAYS

On Monday 22nd March, 12 students from Years 9-11 participated in a CI (Construction Induction) White Card course at the Bright Community Centre that was organised by the



Alpine Shire. The aim of the course is to prepare students to work safely in the Construction Industry and it is endorsed by and meets the requirements of WorkSafe Victoria for induction training in the building and construction industry. As part of the course, students gained an overview of basic Occupational Health and Safety principles and legislation, and an understanding of hazards, risks, and control measures. On successful completion of the course, each student will receive a card issued by WorkSafe Victoria.



Once completed, students can participate in work experience and / or employment on a building site in the future.

Whole School Dress Up Day- Super Hero Theme: Students are encouraged to dress up themselves and their bike/scooter/skateboard.



It was a busy 3 weeks for the students, their Australian host partners and families, the College community and many local businesses and groups. Students spent time visiting different classes across the College; giving informative presentations about their local area, Bad Aibling in Bavaria; they participated in PE classes, learning the unfamiliar game of netball; undertook some cross-cultural sharing and research with class 6A; touched a snake! (during the Reptile Incursion) and cooked sausage rolls and ANZAC biscuits with Ms Mapley (just to mention a few activities).

Some of the interesting excursions that the students were able to attend included visiting Dumu café to learn about this local social enterprise and indigenous training café that also included making damper; Bright museum to see some of our local historical artefacts; an informative presentation at the Alpine Shire Offices; enjoying a come-and-try with the Bright Croquet club and a visit to the Bright CFA fire station. Thank you to all who were involved with this program – it certainly is a program that involves the wider Bright Community and provides so many learning opportunities to all of our Bright P-12 College students as well as our visiting guests. We are very grateful for the strong community support this program receives.


Yr 5/6 APEX HIKE

Did you know, the Alpine L2P Program just celebrated more than 10 years of delivery and we are proud of the fact the we have supported over 130 learners to get their P plates.

Recently, Alpine L2P have focused on increasing our mentor numbers across the Shire, so we can support more youth the get their P plates. That focus has paid off and we now have mentors in Bright who are in need of learners.

So, if you are having trouble getting your 120 hours and need some assistance, this is the program for you. There are eligibility requirements but we look at each learner on an individual basis, so ask us first.

School preparedness and pre-emptive actions for the bushfire season

Schools and early childhood services undertake a range of activities each year to prepare for bushfires and grassfires. The Department of Education conducts an annual fire risk assessment of schools and early childhood services. Those at the greatest levels of risk are published on the Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR). As part of preparing our school for the fire season, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan.



What does this mean for our school?

Our school has been identified as being at risk of bushfire or grassfire and is a Category 3 school. Our school will close on a day forecasted as Catastrophic fire danger rating in North East fire district.

What is the department's policy?

The department's Bushfire and Grassfire Preparedness Policy requires all schools and early childhood services on the BARR to close when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their fire weather district. All school bus routes which travel in or through a district with Catastrophic fire danger must also be cancelled.

When will our school be closed due to Catastrophic fire danger?

Closure of the school due to a forecast Catastrophic day will be confirmed on the day prior and we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day. Any information regarding potential or confirmed Catastrophic fire danger days will be communicated to you by Compass.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. Please be aware that:

- No one will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Catastrophic day.
- Out-of-school-hours care will also be cancelled on these days.
- All bus routes that travel through the Catastrophic area will be cancelled.
- School camps will be cancelled if a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast for fire weather district in which the camp is located, or if the travel involves passing through areas that have Catastrophic fire danger.

Families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan on Catastrophic fire danger rating days. **On such days, children should never be left at home alone or in the care of older children.**

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that when Catastrophic days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Catastrophic day.

What can families and the school community do to help us prepare?

- Ensure we have your current details, including your mobile phone numbers.
- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event
 that our school is closed due to elevated fire danger or closed due to a Catastrophic fire danger. Further
 information can be found on the <u>CFA's website</u>.
- Enact your family's bushfire survival plan if your own triggers are met. Our school community may be spread out across many areas and some families may be at higher risk than others. Your family's safety is critical, so please let us know if you are enacting your bushfire survival plan and if your children will be absent on these days.
- If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.


