

PROJECT ROCKIT

A team of experts from Melbourne come to our school to host a series of presentations at the Bright Community Centre with a large screen, young engaging presenters, games and activities.



Year 5/6 students learnt about building inclusive school communities with strategies and empathy to combat social exclusion and increase awareness of diverse perspectives. Students explored how everyone is different and how to celebrate those differences. The presenters allowed the students to understand the feelings associated with inclusion/exclusion through engaging activities which really allowed the students to broaden their perspective and sense of compassion.



Year 7/8 were given a presentation exploring the positive potential of technology, up-skilling students to build connected communities, support

wellbeing and navigate harmful experiences online. Students discussed the platforms they are currently using so that experts could educate them on the safety of these platforms. Students were shown examples of what to be careful of online and tips for online support. Year 9/10 students were empowered to create a culture that challenges bullying behaviour, both online and in person. They learnt strategies to take action and unite together, instead of standing by watching. Students engaged in a game with peers on stage and had a lot of fun whilst learning new skills and concepts.

Overall it was a wonderful day, everyone came away with a sense of empowerment and understanding. We can all work together to support our students and local community towards being part of the solution with online safety!

CAREERS UPDATE



Earlier this month, all Year 9 students sat the Victorian State Government funded online My Career Insights Morrisby aptitude test.

The test ran for 4 lessons during which students completed a range of activities that aimed to identify their natural abilities. Students completed tasks focused on word association, number patterns, logic,

spatial awareness, mechanical systems as well as personality and interests. In the coming weeks all students will have the opportunity to participate in an interview with an independent consultant who will explain their results and so expand their appreciation of the career pathways open to them. The test and interviews aim to support students and their families to identify study and career pathway options as they move into senior school and beyond. Student results will be available for them to access anytime online after the interview has been completed.

IDAHOBIT DAY

On May 17, we dressed up in support of IDAHOBIT Day. IDAHOBIT Day is the International Day Against Homophobia, Biphobia and Transphobia. We commemorate this day to mark the milestone that on May 17 1990, the World Health Organisation removed homosexuality from the Classification of Diseases. Students and staff embraced the opportunity to mark the occasion by dressing up in their brightest rainbow colours.

Students also had the opportunity to perform a dissection on a sheep's pluck. This included the lungs, the heart, the trachea and the diaphragm (even a bonus liver). They saw a real example of the anatomy they had learnt. Students were thoroughly engaged and amazed at the difference in look and feel of the internal organs.
