




# NAIDOC WEEK POSTER COMPETITION

### Yr 9 SCIENCE

Year 9 explored how electrical current flows in simple circuits. Students also got to see the Van De Graaff Electrostatic Generator in action. Here the machine strips electrons from the device making the dome and anything touching it very negatively charged. This creates an electrostatic differential/potential between the dome and its surroundings. When sufficiently high enough, this potential can leak into its surroundings in the form of a spark, just like lightning. Some Van De Graaff machines can generate up to 20 million volts.

When pie dishes are placed on top, they too build up a negative charge and they then want to repel each other like magnets. This causes the top one to be pushed/repelled away. Anyone touching the machine will also develop a negative charge and you will see their hair stand on end as each negatively charged hair repels its neighbour. 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
