


2023 YEARBOOK




ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY

Wishing you all a wonderful break over the school holidays. I'm looking forward to welcoming you back in Term 4.



NORTH EAST WATER INCURSION

Last week, our Prep, Year 1 and Year 2 students delved into an engaging exploration of water sources and conservation, with the help of educators and scientists from Petaurus Education Group. They discovered the origins of the water that flows from our taps and learned valuable Water Wise practices to apply at school and at home.

This enriching experience was part of North East Water's pilot program, offering students hands-on learning opportunities with dedicated educators and scientists. The program emphasizes the significance of responsible water usage and the importance of preserving the cleanliness of our waterways. Students also gained insight into the vital role water bugs play in maintaining the health of our rivers, creeks, and dams.

North East Water is a provider of water and sewage services, serving approximately 115,000 residents in 39 towns across a vast 20,000 square kilometres of north-east Victoria.













Yr 7 MATHS

In Maths last week, students applied their knowledge of area and volume to a real life situation involving the veggie boxes at school. They needed to measure the boxes using tape measures to determine the area and volume in order to work out how much plastic liner, soil and paint to purchase. Luckily we found time between precipitation events!





JAPANESE - ONIGIRI

With help from Minako, our Japanese Language Assistant, we were able to make Onigiri in class. Onigiri is translated as a rice triangle. Students learnt the difference between Sushi and Onigiri, and learnt how to form the rice into a triangle shape. We were so happy to hear the reports some students tried making some Onigiri at home!

DEFENCE FORCE CAREERS EXPO

Earlier this month, 29 students from Years 9-12 attended the Defence Force Careers Expo at Puckapunyal Military Area. This event was developed to showcase the variety of careers (full-time and part-time) available in the Army and Defence Forces.

It provided students with an insight into:

- Benefits within The Australian Army, which is one of the world's leading military forces.
- A valuable opportunity to have one-on-one discussions with ADF members to discuss their experiences and lifestyle.
- Interaction with Defence Force Recruiting (DFR) team about current job vacancies, salary and benefits, Defence University Sponsorship, Defence Force Academy, GAP Year, STEM opportunities.

Students were able to see a range of equipment on display, including Main Battle Tanks, Light Armoured Vehicles, Armoured Personnel Carriers, Protected Mobility Vehicles (Bushmaster and Hawkei), M777 Guns, Air Defence Systems, Unmanned Aerial Systems and communications systems. Students were also able to participate in several hands-on activities including a physical training lesson run by Physical Training Instructors from the Australian Army as well as the opportunity to ride in some of Army's vehicles.

HOME ENERGY KIT


Representatives from the Alpine Shire Council Sustainability area visited our school to talk to Year 5 and 6 students about the Home Energy and Water Efficiency Tool Kits. The representatives demonstrated how each element in the kit works and explained how they can be hired for free from libraries in Mount Beauty, Myrtleford and Bright.

Students learnt how implementing just a few small changes can benefit the environment and their household expenditure.

The kit comes with a printed guide containing complete instructions on how to conduct your own home energy and water efficiency assessment. Instructions in the guide allow school aged children aged 8 and up to attempt this assessment, so that everyone can get involved.

You can also hire a copy of 'Your Home', a complementary resource to accompany use of the home energy kit.

If you are a primary school student and you are interested in using this kit to conduct a home assessment, you will need the supervision of a parent or guardian to use the equipment provided.
