VCAL 12 BRIGHT VINES 2022 VINTAGE

This years 12 Bright Vines wine vintage is underway.

Early in February, VCAL Students netted the grapes to prevent birds and other animals from getting to them in the final stages of maturing.

During this stage the grapes increase in size and sweetness.

A few weeks later in mid March, students were back at the College vineyard to remove the nets and harvest the grapes.

This took two to three hours and produced a good quantity for production.

Mike Dalbosco of Dalbosco Wines collected the grapes which are then taken to Ringer Reef for processing.

Over the next few months VCAL students will be involved in the bottling and labelling of this years vintage.

WADEYE/BRIGHT EXCHANGE OPPORTUNITY

Over many years, Bright P-12 College has had a very special relationship with the Wadeye community. One we greatly appreciate and hold very dear. As part of that relationship, students from Wadeye have come to Bright P-12 College to complete their education and students from Bright P-12 College have gone to Wadeye for an excursion. After a review of the programs last year, we have now refreshed and redesigned the programs into one.

We now incorporate both aspects of the program in a reciprocal arrangement with Bright and Wadeye communities. 8 Students from Bright P-12 College will travel to Wadeye at the end of Term 2 to visit the community and engage in cultural activities.

During Term 2 & 3, students from Bright & Wadeye selected for the program will engage in activities online to develop a group project to benefit their communities. The Bright P-12 College students will also engage in fundraising to support the students traveling to Wadeye.

In Term 4, 8 students from Wadeye travel to Bright to homestay with families for the term and attend Bright P-12 College. The Thamarrur youth indigenous corporation in partnership with Bright P-12 College will provide support and guidance for students and families involved in the program.

WELLBEING WITH BETHANY

Ease the transition into school holidays

Some parents can be thrown a curve ball in the school holidays, seeing behaviours during the school holidays which may not be seen during the school term. This can leave families feeling confused, especially with fun and relaxing activities planned.

Not all kids enjoy the school holidays. Despite them feeling excited about the holidays and looking forward to them, there can also be an element where it can represent challenges. Some challenges can include the change in routine or the lack of routine. The familiarity of routine allows for predictability that some children thrive in.

How can you help the transition into school holidays:

Have a visual **holiday calendar** (download a free month calendar from the internet or create your own) where you can include planned activities, such as watching a movie, catching up with friends, home days, shopping trips, down time etc. Having something written or drawn on the holiday calendar provides a reference point of what is coming up, what to look forward to, equally limit the question 'what are we doing today?'. It is important to also acknowledge the need for downtime.

Creating **anchor points** during the day. This doesn't need to necessarily stick to the strict routine during the school term while on holidays (one of the benefits is to have that flexibility) but for children who are looking for structure it is helpful having anchor points and following a similar routine in the morning and evening.

Have an **Ideas Jar** for the kids who want to do all the things (where from a time and financial perspective may not be possible). When get ask questions such as 'I want to do/go....' you are able to respond and say 'that's a great idea, pop it in the jar'. When there is a free day then an idea gets picked from the jar. This can help with getting around the feeling of having to say 'no' to your children a lot of the time. When managing not being able to do ideas, come back to the holiday calendar. This visually allows kids to see that there are limited days in the holidays and they cannot do all the ideas/activities. Depending on developmental age, children may not have the same understanding of time as adults do.

YEAR 9 SCIENCE



















PRIMARY GERMAN













