Yr 12 SCIENCE

In this experiment, students are completing a titration to analyse the concentration of ascorbic acid in a Vitamin C tablet. Volumetric analysis is a method of quantitative chemical analysis that uses volumes to analyse substances in solution by measuring the volumes required to perform a chemical reaction.

TELL US WHAT YOU THINK

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents/caregivers/guardians think of our school. The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behavior, and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.



Approximately 30 per cent of parents/carers have been invited via email to participate in this year's survey and we encourage all invited families to participate in this survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey will be conducted from Monday 15th August to Friday 16th September. The survey will be conducted online, only takes 20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Simplified Chinese, Chin (Hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.

GIRLS' AFL FOOTBALL CLINICS

Across the last fortnight, we have had four full days of AFL football clinics for all girls at Bright P-12 College.

These sessions have coincided with the beginning of the AFLW season and we hope to have inspired the next generation of young footballers and athletes across the region. The feedback from those involved in the sessions has been extremely positive and we look forward to providing similar sporting opportunities in the near future.









INDIGENOUS STUDIES

During class recently, the Year 12 Indigenous Languages students visited the Library to view the current book display in the foyer. This display has an Indigenous theme with some books relating to the Dreamtime stories, others have information and stories about Indigenous people who have achieved wonderful things in history and science.

STORIES FROM OUR LIBRARY


One of our new books in the Library is called The First Scientists—Deadly Inventions and Innovations from Australia's First Peoples by Corey Tutt, a proud Kamilaroi man.



In this book, beautifully illustrated by Blak Douglas, Corey tells us the stories of how Australia's First Peoples innovated in the fields of astronomy, engineering, chemistry, forensic science, bush medicine and more. This book brings science to life and our younger students were inspired by the story of two Whadjuk people who were employed in August 1864 as bush trackers (early forensic scientists) to find three children Isaac Cooper (aged 9), Jane Cooper (aged 7) and Frank Duff (aged 3) who were lost in the bush for nine winter days. Being nearly 160 years ago, this was well before the age of mobile phones, GPS and emergency beacons.

Yr 12 VISUAL COMMUNICATION & DESIGN

In Year 12 of the VCD course, students have explored the design process in the three areas of Industrial, Communication and Environmental Design. They are now in the process of completing an in-depth Design Study, focussing on two distinct design needs, from initial brief and concepts to final design.














BADMINTON STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS


