### ALPINE SHIRE YOUTH AWARDS

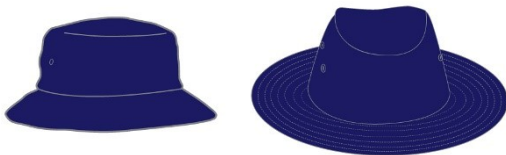

# Yr 10 PRODUCT DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY

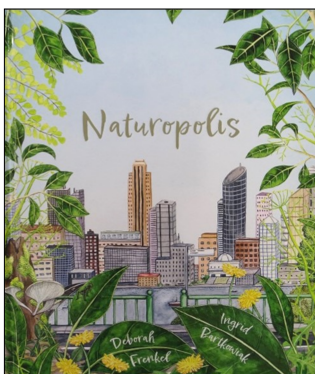
This year's Product Design class is amazing. I just had to say that right from the beginning! Each year we embark on designing and making a Cape Cod Chair.

They really do foster an amazing learning environment. Well done to each and every student. By Mr Jackson

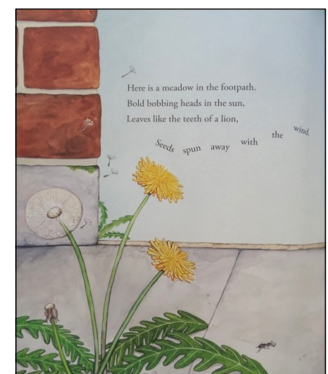


## STORIES FROM OUR LIBRARY

Div 4 Female Moguls – Rhylee T 10th Place

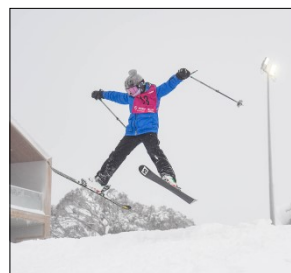
Div 5 Male Moguls – Sullivan F 10th Place

## GERMAN EXCHANGE PROGRAM



We have re-started our Exchange Program with our sister school in Germany. At the end of September, 6 Year 10 students departed Australia to participate in a 10 week exchange program. They are each living with a host family and attending daily classes at our German sister school. The program aims to develop their German language skills as well as provide an opportunity to be immersed in another culture.

We have been running this Exchange Program since 2009 and it has continued on an annual basis ever since. The program involves students travelling and spending time in the country without teachers from their own school. It is a reciprocal program which means students live with their host partner in

Germany during Term 4 and then their host partner comes to Australia for Term 1 in 2023.

Bright P-12 College is one of only 12 schools in Victoria that is registered with the VRQA as a Secondary Exchange Organisation and able to provide an extended exchange program to its students and those from our sister school. The global pandemic meant the 2020 program was cut short and no programs were offered until this year.

It is so exciting that we have been able to get our programs back up and running and that there is such interest from the students and their families. The Exchange is a wonderful opportunity for students to improve their German language skills. Students make life long friends not only with their host partner and their family, but they also remain connected to some of their new school friends for many years to come. They return to the VCE German classroom with stronger language skills and increased confidence to complete their studies. Students involved with the program in 2022/ 2023 are: Alison C, Ryley G, Kira M, Ava Mck, Billy M and Yannick P. They are looking forward to seeing some of the sights such as exploring the city of Munich, visiting some of King Ludwig's castles and eating Bretzels.

Another option for our students learning German is a shorter 4-week Cultural Trip. In this program, Bright P-12 College teachers and students visit Germany for 4 weeks and Bright P-12 College hosts a reciprocal visit. The Cultural Trip provides students with many varied local activities, aiming to showcase local sights and aspects of culture. This program of a short, escorted group trip takes place on a bi-annual basis. The next Cultural Trips are scheduled for 2023. Bright P-12 College will host a group in February and send a group in September.

**Update:** Our students have arrived in Bad Aibling, Bavaria and started their 10-week exchange in Germany.

They are settling into life with their host families and attending our sister school.

We're looking forward to hearing about their adventures as they explore the area with their host families.



## Yr 12 LIONS CLUB LUNCH

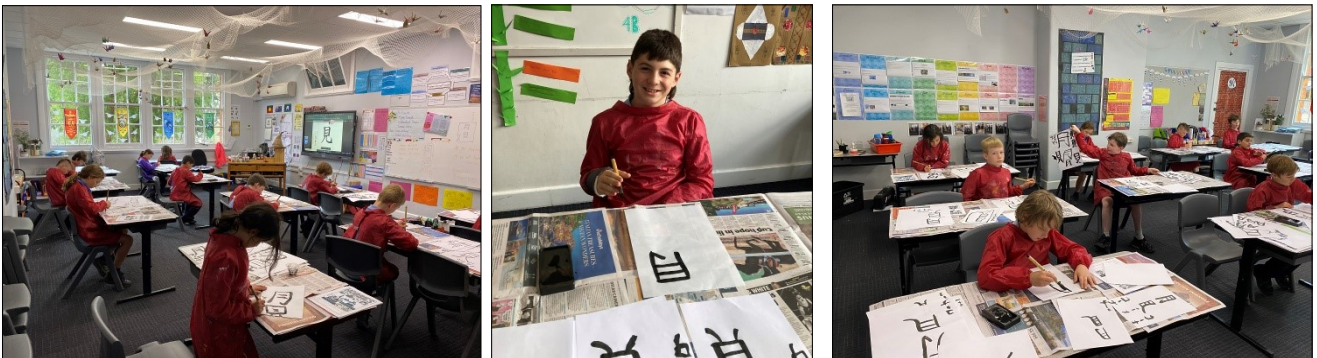
## SPACE SCIENCE INCURSION

Educators from the Victorian Space Science Education Centre (VSSEC) came to Bright P-12 College last term and ran sessions on water rocket propulsion for our Year 6, 7 and 8 students. They built and launched water rockets on the school basketball court and oval. Students developed their understanding of how forces act on a rocket at various stages in the launching, flight and landing process.



## JAPANESE UPDATE

They were able to choose their own subject matter and they worked with acrylic and Posca Paint Pens for the finer detail. Students were all very pleased with their results, and rightly so, as the finished works are impressive. Students were also tasked to develop their understanding of tone in a freehand pencil sketch.



## TECH TALK

On reflection of the recent OPTUS hacking, here are some suggestions to help protect your online information:

1. Read the fine print of contracts before signing up to companies online. Who has access to your personal information? Where does it go and why?
2. Limit the amount of money you can transfer per day from a bank account.
3. Change your passwords regularly.
4. Investigate if you require a V.P.N or/and have a program such as 'Norton' installed.
5. Change companies if your information is breached.



**What is a V.P.N ?** VPN stands for "Virtual Private Network" and describes the opportunity to establish a protected network connection when using public networks. VPNs encrypt your internet traffic and disguise your online identity. This makes it more difficult for third parties to track your activities online and steal data.
